 - → 0.25 B€ for Digital Tanzania
 - → 2.5 B€, DE for hosting refugees (2016)
 - → 5.4 B€ asked by Banca Monte dei Paschi di Siena SpA to be saved
 - → 55.2 B€ operational Costs for EU Frontex border control (total 89 B€)





- Catalyst for Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- Pilots for Digital Inclusion through Internet light for all
 - → Focus in Tanzania on health
 - → Focus in DRC on education/work
