

 - fri tilgang til informasjon for alle








Goals

- Access to Information for all
 - "Nobody should be left out from the Digital Society"
 - Give everyone access to digital information
- Traditional business models are too slow
 - Mobile broadband roll-out dominated by return on investment
 - → Premier league, Bollywood outranges non-profit content
- Providing at least one Information Spot in each village
 - Internet light for all free access to information
 - Paid access to profitable content sustainable solution


Internet light for All

Road Infrastructure

- Basic infrastructure
 - → free usage for pedestrians & cyclisis
 - authentication for cars
 - → Pay for use model when a license plate is required
- Highways & toll roads
 - speed & comfort
 - often privately managed
- Railways

- Complementarity



FNs bærekraftsmål og Agenda 2030:

Tyskland har valgt denne agendaen som et bakteppe for hele sitt program for formannskapet, og jeg leder en gruppe i FN som skal drive frem gjennomføringen.

Vi vil arbeide for at G20 går foran med egne konkrete forpliktelser for å bidra til å oppnå bærekraftsmålene.

2. Migrasjon og partnerskap med Afrika:

Verden opplever den største flyktningstrømmen siden andre verdenskrig. Europa, og ikke minst Tyskland, har sett konsekvensene av det.

Det er nødvendig å bedre situasjonen der folk bryter opp ifra.

Tyskland vil bruke sitt formannskap til å gjøre noe med problemene der folk hører hjemme. Det er ikke minst jobbskaping og private investeringer. Det innebærer avtaler med afrikanske land som ønsker å få det til.

G20 kan altså bidra til at land og internasjonale organisasjoner bruker sine ressurser mer på tiltak som skaper vekst og jobbskaping.

3. Helse og utdanning.

Her har Norge lenge hatt et tungt internasjonalt engasjement. Utdanning og helse henger sammen med økonomisk vekst.



- The catalyst for the SDGs



2. Migration and partnership with Africa:

The world is experiencing the greatest influx of refugees since World War II. Europe, and especially Germany, have seen the consequences of that.

It is necessary to improve the situation where people break up close.

Germany will use its chairmanship to do something about the problems which people belong. There is no minimum job creation and private investment. There are agreements with African countries wishing to achieve it.

G20 can therefore help the countries and international organizations use their resources more on measures which create growth and job creation.

- Funding requirements
 - → 0.25 B€ for Digital Tanzania
 - → 2.5 B€, DE for hosting refugees (2016)
 - → 5.4 B€ asked by Banca Monte dei Paschi di Siena SpA to be saved
 - → 55.2 B€ operational Costs for EU Frontex border control (total 89 B€)

- Participation in the Digital Society






3. Health and education.

Norway has long had a heavy international involvement. Education and health are associated with economic growth.












Established Pilot


