Highlights & Lessons learned

- Multi-disciplinary teamwork
- Animations very well received
 - Important messages repeated by users
- The need for internet in our villages
- The immediate knowledge uptake
- The work with TZ- ground team and the sub-village leaders
- Ownership in the villages
- Presentations internationally and nationally



Main impressions from fieldwork and analysis

- Participants in the intervention village appreciate the digital health messages
 - In the first follow-up, only 1 out of 280 reported that they did not like the digital health messages, and 270 out of 280 reported that they learned something from them
- The importance of culturally sensitive content
- Unbiased health messages of high quality
- In local language

- Last round of fieldwork in the making
- Analysis process, in Stata and Nvivo
- Four publications in the making
- Recent comment in The Lancet Digital Health

- Analysing and writing, writing, writing...

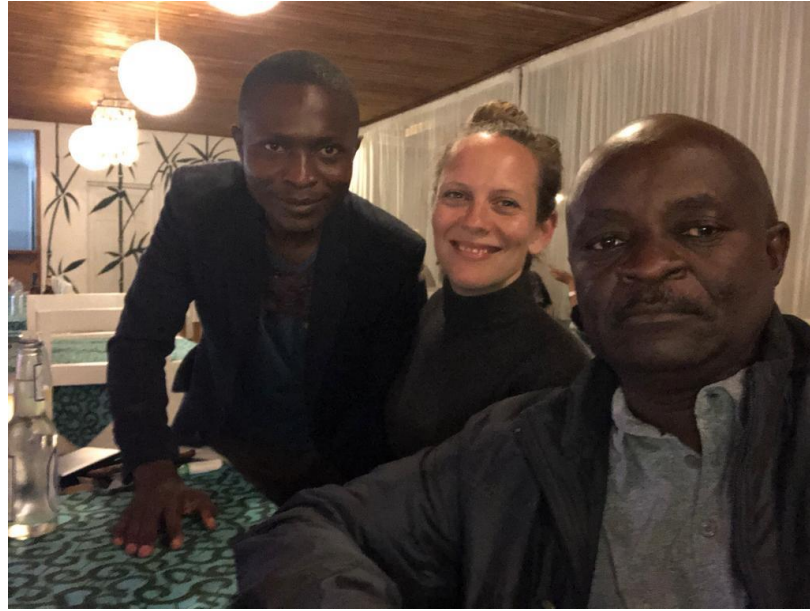


Recommendations
