Theme 1: Demand and partnerships for innovation

In the development and promotion of innovations, harnessing partnerships is important to ensure local demand is met while anchoring the innovation within the local contexts. In order to accommodate for this, the Vision 2030 mechanism has required that all projects should have a local partner before the implementation phase starts. What are the experiences with such a set-up, and how can possible challenges be addressed and reduced in the future? Based on the experiences from the projects, in this session we aim to discuss how the Vision 2030 mechanism can most effectively ensure local anchoring and demand for the innovation projects funded.

Theme 2: Implementation & scaling up

In order to succeed with implementation and scaling up of an innovation, there is often a need to comply with local infrastructures, institutions, regulations and cultures. Several of the projects funded in the Vision 2030 mechanism have made adjustments to their solutions in close dialogue with users. Still, many of the projects report to have met various challenges during implementation such as a lack of basic infrastructure (e.g. mobile coverage), and financial, technical and legal resources (e.g. approvals from the local authorities). In this session we aim to discuss how the Vision 2030 mechanism can reduce such mismatches and improve the likelihood for successful implementation and upscaling of the projects funded

Theme 3: Visjon2030 and the SDGs

The main aims of the Visjon2030 program, from its inception, are addressing societal challenges in education and health with a broader ambition of alleviating poverty and contributing to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In this panel, we critically examine the extent to which the Visjon2030 projects address and contribute to the SDGs in their conceptualization and eventual results. Based on the experiences of the Visjon2030 projects, the panel discusses mechanisms for measurement of results from innovations and their contribution to the achievement of the SDGs.
